<u>Literacy</u> Reading

You should all now have a login for Reading Eggs. Please use this fantastic resource at home on a computer, iPad or phone to help your child to read. They can use this programme on their own or alongside an adult. It is incredibly important you read with your child 3-5 times a week, even if it is reading to your child at bedtime. It really supports their reading development. Please remember to sign the yellow reading record everytime you read together.

<u>Writing</u>

During our writing sessions we will be ensuring that we form our letters in the correct direction and we will be encouraging the children to use full stops, finger spaces and capital letters iindependently. We are also working on our sentence writing skills.

<u>Maths</u>

During the Spring term, the children will be working on their number facts. We will be learning how to subtract numbers within 10 and begin a new topic on position.

You can support your children at home by asking them to recognise numbers in the environment (shops, house numbers, telephone numbers etc) and also asking them questions about where things are placed (e.g. over/under something).
